

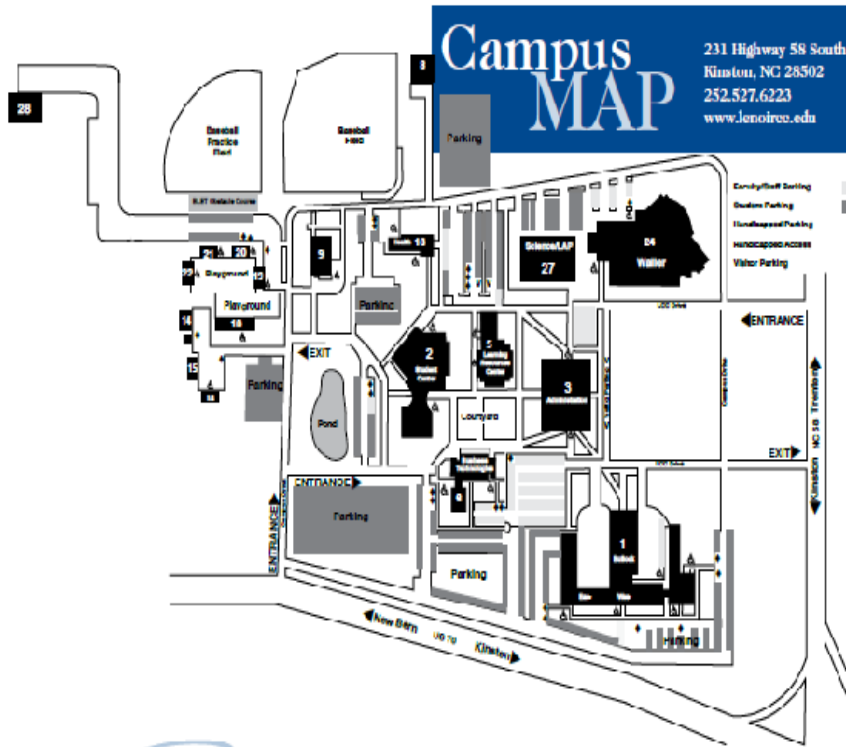

### **FIP-3304 FFI & II Fire Behavior (12 Hours)**

**Section # 1201**

**Instructor: Randy Jones**

**Saturday 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. and Sunday 8 a.m. – 12 p.m.**

This course will present the firefighter candidate with the stages of fire, the products of combustion, and the methods of heat transfer. This course will enable the firefighter candidate to demonstrate his/her knowledge in the terminology used in the area of fire behavior, the hazards of different fuels and the types of heat sources.

### **FIP-3305 FFI & II Portable Fire Extinguishers (6 Hours)**

**Section # 1202**

**Instructor: Staff**

**Sunday 8 a.m. – 3 p.m.**

This course will present the firefighter candidate with the proper use of portable extinguishers and the demonstration of the actual extinguishment of a Class A and B fire.

### **FIP-3306 FFI & II Personal Protective Equipment (15 Hours)**

The firefighter candidate will be presented the function of each article of protective equipment, the leading causes of death of firefighters, and the hazardous environments requiring use of protective equipment. In addition, there is a great deal of information covering the SCBA and its use.

### **FIP-3312 FFI & II Foam Fire Streams (6 Hours)**

The firefighter candidate will gain an understanding of foam generation and the types of foam and their uses.

**FIP-3318 FFI & II Water Supplies (18 hours)**

**Friday 6 – 10 p.m., Saturday 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. and Sunday 8 a.m. – 3 p.m.**

The firefighter candidate will be presented material during this course that will enable him/her to demonstrate both forward and reverse hose lays from the use of a pressurized hydrant and the use of mobile water supplies. This course will cover relay pumping and the basic components of a local water distribution system. **(Friday night attendance is mandatory).**

***Turnout gear without SCBA required.***

**FIP-3319 FFI & II Sprinklers (15 Hours)**

**Section # 1206**

**Instructor: Staff**

**Saturday 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. and Sunday 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.**

This course deals with the value of sprinkler systems, the identification and use of sprinkler systems and fire department support of automatic sprinkler systems. This course covers the various types of sprinkler systems as well as their components and the reliability of automatic sprinkler systems.

***Turnout gear without SCBA required.***

**FIP-3353 HazMat Decontamination (16 Hours)**

**Section # 1207**

**Instructor: David Ricke**

**Saturday and Sunday 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.**

This course will expose the Hazardous Materials Level One Responder to the knowledge and skills needed to perform the following tasks safely and effectively: (1) plan a response utilizing mass and technical decontamination processes to minimize the hazard; (2) implement the planned response to favorably change the outcomes consistent with standard operating procedures and the site safety and control plan; (3) evaluate the progress of the planned response; and (4) terminate the incident by providing reports and documentation of decontamination operations.

***Full turnout gear and SCBA required.***

***Students must meet minimum age requirements (18 years of age or older.)***

**FIP-3601 D/O Emergency Vehicle Driving (20 Hours)**

**Section # 1208**

**Instructor: Brian Pearce**

**Friday 6 – 10 p.m., Saturday and Sunday 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.**

This course deals with the safe operation of emergency vehicles, driving skills, legal implications of emergency driving and departmental standard operating procedures. This course is a stand-alone certification and is also a prerequisite to Driver Operator certification by the North Carolina Fire Rescue Commission. ***(Friday night attendance is mandatory.)*** ***Students must meet minimum age requirements (18 years of age or older) and possess a valid NC Driver License.***

**FIP-3621 D/O EVD – Trailer Towing Operations (12 Hours)**

**Section # 1209**

**Instructor: Robert Godwin**

**Saturday 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. and Sunday 8 a.m. – 12 p.m.**

This course will present the knowledge, skills, and ability to satisfy the NFPA 1002 Fire Apparatus Driver/Operator Professional Qualifications, 2009 edition for trailer towing operations.

***Students must meet minimum age requirements (18 years of age or older) and possess a valid NC Driver License.***

**FIP-3611 D/O Basic Pump Operations (20 Hours)**

**Section # 1210**

**Instructor: Billy Huggins**

**Friday 6 – 10 p.m., Saturday and Sunday 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.**

This course will review and explain basic elements of pump operations including priming, lift, drafting, pumping from a hydrant, setting engine pressure and calculating friction loss.

***Turnout gear without SCBA required. (Friday night attendance is mandatory.)*** ***Students must meet minimum age requirements (18 years of age or older) and possess a valid NC Driver License.***

**FIP-3613 D/O Sprinkler and Standpipe (15 Hours)**

**Section # 1211**

**Instructor: Staff**

**Saturday 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. and Sunday 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.**

This course will discuss and detail operations regarding set up and supply operations for pump operators for sprinkler systems and wet and dry standpipe systems. It will include a review of control valves, pressure settings and operations procedures.

***Turnout gear without SCBA required.***

***Students must meet minimum age requirements (18 years of age or older) and possess a valid NC Driver License.***

**FIP-3714 Chief 101 (12 Hours)**

**Section #1212**

**Instructor: Chief Rick McIntyre**

**Friday 6 – 10 p.m. and Saturday 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.**

This class will satisfy the 9S inspection criteria as specified by the North Carolina Administrative Code. The primary objective of the course is to inform current and future chief officers of the various aspects and complexities surrounding the operations and organization of North Carolina fire departments. Emphasis will be placed on ratings and inspections, NFIRS reporting, prevention and grant programs, basic line-of-duty death information, financial considerations, and an overview of the various expectations facing a chief officer. **(Friday night attendance is mandatory.)**

**FIP-5570 Technical Rescuer: Agricultural Machinery Rescue (28 Hours)**

**Section # 1213**

**Instructors: Fleming Taylor and Frank White**

**Saturday and Sunday 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. (March 10-11)**

**Saturday 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. and Sunday 8 a.m. – 12 p.m. (March 24-25)**

***This is a two weekend course. You must attend both weekends to complete course.***

This class will present the rescue technician (RT) with the elements that come into play at agricultural machinery rescue incidents. Pre-planning, site-surveys, incident plans and size up will be covered. Design features of various pieces of farm equipment will be discussed. Upon completion, the RT will have practical skills for correctly gaining access to, stabilizing the environment, the machinery, and the patient; as well as packaging and removing the patient from an agricultural rescue incident.

***Minimum PPE requirement: Helmet, boots, gloves, eye protection, and full body coverage (coveralls, turnout gear, and/or long pants with long sleeve shirt.)***

***Students must meet minimum age requirements (18 years of age or older.)***

**FIP-5602 Technical Rescuer: General: Personal Protective Equipment (8 Hours)**

**Section # 1214**

**Instructor: Joe Burris**

**Saturday 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.**

This class will introduce to the Technical Rescuer the need for and use of personal protective equipment to enable the rescuer to perform his/her duties in a safe and responsible manner. Physical characteristics of rescuers, stress, endurance, and the limitations of equipment will be discussed.

*SCBA required.*

**FIP-5603 Technical Rescuer: General: Rescue Equipment (6 Hours)**

**Section # 1215**

**Instructor: Joe Burris**

**Sunday 8 a.m. – 3 p.m.**

This class will introduce the Technical Rescuer to the operation and function of various tools and equipment commonly used in rescue operations. This course will also present procedures for care, inspection, and maintenance of personal protective equipment, tactical equipment, and apparatus. The value of periodic inspection and maintenance to reduce the chances of unexpected equipment failure, performance failure, disabling injuries, and fatalities will be discussed.

**FIP-5605 Technical Rescuer: General: Rescue Rigging (15 Hours)**

**Section # 1216**

**Instructor: Staff**

**Saturday 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. and Sunday 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.**

This course will present to the Technical Rescuer the proper use of ropes and other related rescue rigging equipment used during rescue operations. This course will involve the setup of various ladder and timber configuration for technical rescues.

*Helmet, gloves, and eye protection required.*

**FIP-5701 Technical Rescuer: VMR: Rescue Ops (12 Hours)**

**Section # 1217**

**Instructor: Staff**

**Saturday 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. and Sunday 8 a.m. – 12 p.m.**

This class will present the Technical Rescuer the hazards of vehicle rescue operations, ICS, access, disentanglement, extrication, and the post rescue phases of vehicle rescue.

*Turnout gear without SCBA required.*

**FIP-5703 Technical Rescuer: VMR: Stabilize & Extricate (15 Hours)**

**Section # 1218**

**Instructor: Chris Rayner**

**Saturday 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. and Sunday 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.**

This class will present to the Technical Rescuer the steps to stabilize a vehicle on four wheels, a side-resting vehicle and a roof-resting vehicle. The Technical Rescuer will also be introduced to procedures for the following: opening a jammed door using a hinge attack and a latch attack, how to create a third door, total door removal, sidewall removal, working with a collapsed roof, creating the roof flap, C-B-A roof pillar cut, procedures for total roof removal, trunk tunneling, through the floor access, how to displace a steering column, dash roll, removal and/or relocation of pedals, and how to remove and/or relocate seats.

*Turnout gear without SCBA required plus safety glasses or goggles.*

**FIP-6402 NCRIT: Firefighter Survival (16 Hours)**

**Section # 1219**

**Instructor: Scott Justice**

**Friday 6 – 10 p.m., Saturday 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. and Sunday 8 a.m. – 12 p.m.**

The Firefighter Self Survival course focuses on identifying a firefighter emergency and teaches how to safely perform self-rescue from the emergency. This is a physically demanding course, and requires full protective clothing including SCBA and a spare bottle. This is one of three courses that make the North Carolina Rapid Intervention Team Certification. *(Friday night attendance is mandatory.)*

*Full turnout gear and SCBA with an extra bottle required.*

*Students must meet minimum age requirements (18 years of age or older.)*

## NFA Courses

### **Arson Detection for the First Responder (12 Hours)**

**Section # 1220**

**Instructor: Joe Littleton**

**Saturday 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. and Sunday 8am – 12pm**

Basic techniques for determining fire origin and cause, and recognizing primary clues or evidence of arson. This is a National Fire Academy course offering instruction in the proper identification of incendiary fire from the level of a first in firefighter. Students will also learn the basic skills of managing a crime scene and the collection of various forms of evidence.

### **Leadership I (12 Hours)**

**Section # 1221**

**Instructor: Staff**

**Saturday 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. and Sunday 8 a.m. – 12 p.m.**

This course provides the company officer with the basic leadership skills and tools needed to perform effectively in the fire service environment. The course addresses ethics, use and abuse of power at the company officer level, creativity in the fire service environment, and management of the multiple roles of the company officer.

## Specialty Fire Courses

### **Introduction to Firefighting (20 Hours)**

**Section # 1222**

**Instructor: Norman “Bo” Hobbs**

**Friday 6 – 10 p.m., Saturday and Sunday 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.**

This course is designed for the new firefighter with little or no experience. Basics to be covered include ladders, SCBA, fire streams, hose practices, etc. Practical applications will be used extensively. *(Friday night attendance is mandatory.)*  
*Full turnout gear and SCBA with an extra bottle required.*

## **EMS Courses**

### **Advanced Assessment and Treatment of Trauma (8 hours)**

**Section # 1223**

**Instructor: Staff**

**Saturday 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.**

**Assessment and Treatment of Trauma (ATT)** is a new international continuing education course from the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons (AAOS) that represents the state-of-the-art in prehospital trauma assessment and management. Based on the most current medical information and best practices, this concise and highly interactive continuing education course covers the critical knowledge and skills necessary to rapidly evaluate, stabilize, and transport the trauma patient.

ATT offers students an engaging course that expands their knowledge of trauma concepts and promotes critical thinking through case-based learning, hands-on skills stations, live-action video and small group scenarios. Innovative student resources that include a Precourse Online Module and ATT Audio Book allow students to experience true hybrid learning.
