LCC Distance Education Classes Information

Lenoir Community College's Distance Education Programs provide accessible learning opportunities to students who cannot attend traditional on-campus classes due to situational barriers. Distance Education courses are offered in several different formats.

Hybrid courses combine the elements of traditional classroom-base instruction with the tools of online distance delivery. Hybrid courses have reduced classroom time and use Blackboard to compensate for the reduced classroom time. A section number beginning with "HY" identifies a Hybrid course.

Information Highway courses are taught from the LCC campus and received at various distant sites. These courses feature live video and audio interaction between the instructor at LCC and students at the receiving sites. These courses have a section number of "IH." LCC is also a receiving site for NCIH courses originating at other institutions.

Internet courses are identified by section numbers beginning with "IN." Students anywhere in the world can take these courses. It is possible to apply for admission, register, and complete these courses without ever coming on campus.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ONLINE COURSES:

1. Have completed the enrollment procedure listed in the admissions information section on page two.
2. Have a reliable desktop or laptop computer with Windows 98 or better.
3. Have a reliable Internet connection with at least a 56K or higher modem (high-speed internet preferred).
4. Have a valid email account.
5. Be able to use an Internet browser (Netscape or Microsoft IE) to conduct searches and download/upload files from the Internet.
6. Word processing skills (MS Word is the preferred format for most course document file submittals. You may use other word processors and save the files in MS Word format).
