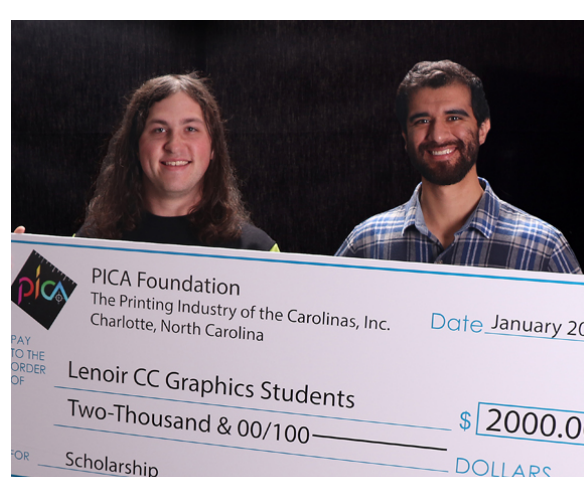
Kramer excels on and off the field accepted at The Citadel
